

## Features added to Troy Vision V3.0.74.0

### Mandatory Contact Types

It is now possible to configure Troy so that when creating or amending contact details via the company, the contact type cannot be left blank or set to 'Unknown'.

The new setting can be found within the *creation settings* section under the company tab as shown in *fig 1*.

### Other

When doing a look up search on candidates/contacts or companies it is now possible to do a wildcard search which will bring up names containing the text entered. For example, if you wish to find all the people with a surname containing 'van' you would enter \*van within the search criteria. This feature can be used on the first name, last name and company name fields within the lookup section.

A problem has been resolved where changing the contract start and end times for an ad hoc contract when editing did not reflect the changes.

A history event is now recorded against the contract when dates or pay / charge rates are altered.

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The website field length for candidate / contact & company addresses has been increased to 128 characters to bring it in line with the LinkedIn URL. *Please note, this may cause an issue if you are still also using Troy Enterprise when website addresses longer than 50 characters are encountered.*

The location field within the job website publishing data has been increased from 50 to 80 characters. *As with the company website field length increase, this may cause problems if you are still also using Troy Enterprise to edit Job web details for locations greater than 50 characters. Also, if using an ODBC connection to publish jobs to the website, then you will need to instruct your web designers to increase the location field within the website's database.*

If a new employment is created for a contact, the contact type from the person's previously current employment is now copied over, rather than being set to unknown, unless their type is the primary contact at their previous company.
